


SFU Fei and Milton Wong Experimental Theatre – Access Guide



Access Overview

The SFU Fei and Milton Wong Experimental Theatre is a flexible black box performance venue located on the B2 level of the Goldcorp Centre for the Arts at Simon Fraser University Woodward's. The building offers step-free access via elevator, accessible washrooms on multiple floors, and configurable seating, including wheelchair positions in the front row.

Address

Street address: **149 West Hastings Street, Vancouver, BC**

Wayfinding notes: **Located inside the Goldcorp Centre for the Arts (Simon Fraser University) in the Woodward's building, accessible via street-level Hastings entrance or via courtyard ramps on Cordova.**

Getting Here

Public Transit

- Nearby bus routes: 3, 8, 14, 16, 20, 135, N8, N20, N35
- Most buses stop on Abbott & Hastings (approx. 30–100 m from entrances)
- 135 stops at Abbott & Hastings (eastbound) and Cambie & Hastings (westbound)
- SkyTrain: Stadium–Chinatown or Waterfront Station (approx. 5–10 minute walk)

Parking

- No dedicated accessible parking directly at the entrance
- Accessible drop-off is possible in the alley off of W Cordova
- Paid lots nearby: Abbott & Hastings lot, 65 W Cordova, additional lots on Cordova, Water, and Cambie
- Surfaces vary (some uneven); routes typically require crossing at least one street

Bicycles

- Bike lock-ups located beside the main entrance and in the courtyard
- Mobility scooters may be parked in the bike lock-up area on B2 (no formal scooter parking)

Accessibility of the Building

Entrances

- Wheelchair-accessible entry at Hastings Street level
- Two long accessible ramps from Cordova courtyard
- All main entrances have push-button automatic doors
- Exterior ramps are gently graded, textured, and well lit

Path of Travel

- Step-free route via elevator to B2
- Interior hallways approx. 59" wide with hard, non-slip flooring
- Light-lock corridors at theatre entrance narrow to approx. 45"

Lobby / Rest Areas

- Seating available near the theatre entrance
- Clear accessible routes maintained (tables can be moved as needed)

Policies

- Service and guide dogs welcome
- Scent-free environment not formally required

Accessibility Inside the Theatre

Seating Format

- Black box configuration with risers
- First row is accessible and can be reconfigured for wheelchair positions

Seat Details

- Padded folding chairs with armrests that also fold up
- There are 11 larger width (21.5") seats available, which can be requested in advance by emailing gca_events@sfu.ca with the show name and date.

Mobility Device Seating

- Wheelchair seating available in front row; number configurable with notice
- Companion seating provided directly beside or behind wheelchair positions
- Front-row seats can be removed to accommodate mobility devices

Additional Information

- Front-row seating recommended for blind/low-vision or Deaf/HoH patrons
- Guide dogs can sit under or beside front-row seats

Washrooms

General Access

- Public washrooms on B2, 2, 3, and 4
- All washrooms include accessible stalls
- Gender-neutral washrooms available on B2 and 3

B2 Level (Closest to Theatre)

- Men's accessible stall: Room B2340
- Women's accessible stall: Room B2320
- Accessible stall approx. 5' x 5', with grab bars on right side and behind toilet
- Accessible stall door swings outward

- Emergency pull-cord alarm inside stall
- Automatic faucets, tilted mirrors, towel dispensers approx. 45–48" high
- Baby changing tables available in B2 washrooms

Assisted Listening Devices

Availability

- Hearing assist headsets available; free to borrow with photo ID
- Request from Head Front of House, Guest Services, or ushers

Viewing Considerations

- Interpreters typically placed in front-row or side positions
