Access Overview

This show is in Arabic with English surtitles. The performer speaks, plays music and dances to tell the story of growing up with the name of his brother who was martyred by the IDF at a young age.

How to Experience

The performer will be on stage when the audience enters. There will be no curtain speech.

The mood of the show is intense to match the intensity of the story being told: the story of a man growing up in Palestine, carrying the name of his brother who was killed by the IDF in the First Intifada, a Palestinian revolt against the occupying force of Israel. Although the language of the show is vivid, there are no direct depictions of violence.

The performer is alone on stage the whole time. Throughout the show, he will speak, make music, rap and dance. The audience is expected to watch with a quiet, focussed attention.
